5	Business arising from the previous minutes - Asset Register G.Slocombe advised quote for \$532 to cover basic assets of the Club including merchandise up to the value of \$8000, replica parts up to the value of \$5000 and non-specific assets of up to \$15,600 excluding tractors and the technical library. The broker indicated an independent valuation would be required for the technical library and that other options like Shannons would be better for tractors. He also advised it was not required or worth doing an asset register for donated goods unless they had specific and quantifiable value. The committee are going to review if the recurring cost is in the interests of the Chapter.		Committee to review the ongoing cost vs. risk of insuring our assets.

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6	ACMOC Directors report The following report was provided by N.Clydsdale and read by the secretary in his absence.	
	I wish to apologies for not being able to attend the AGM, I did want to so much to be in attendance and was looking forward to the presentation on the Antarctic D4 journey, have always had a large interest in the Antarctic.	
	As a Director of ACMOC I do have the pleasure of presenting a short report of a number of positive things after a period of negative activity by some members etc. The total membership of the Club 12 months ago was 1,970 and today is currently 2,354 and growing, likewise last year it was costing more per month to run the Club than our income, currently we are now about \$3,000 per month in the black or \$36,000 per year surplus.	
	The Board of Directors (BoD) voted to make US\$50,000 available for 2025 grants for members and chapters to apply for, the grant monies will only be handed out for very exceptional applications for projects that will promote the club etc for 2025. I see that chapter 19 should consider an application for some of these funds for the documentary.	
	The BoD has awarded two Members of the year, One awardee happens to be our very own Daryl Robins for his contribution of a huge volume of scanned documents for the technical library. My congratulations to Daryl.	
	The BoD will be having a special meeting with Jan Meermans regarding what special edition or editions of the magazine for 2025, I ask members who have any ideas to please contact a Director or Jan. Due to the decrease in the number of chapters, jan also is looking for any articles of interest from the general membership.	
	Unfortunately it appear that only one of the seventeen subsidiary chapters in the US are prepared to transition to contract chapter status, this means there will only be three chapters in the US	
	My term as a Director expires end of December this year, Earl Shanks from Chapter 18 has been appointed as a Director for the latter part of this year and will appear on the slate in the 4th Q magazine for a three year term. There will only be seven Directors next year, I do ask members to think about this as there appears to be no members wanting to step forward and lead the Club. Now that things are starting to take a positive tern, maybe some who have been reticent in the past might think again about this duty and put their hand up.	
	A short discussion ensued around the contract/subsidiary Chapter situation in the USA and clarity was provided by the committee.	

## Presidents Report

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M.Hutchings read the following report.

It's been an interesting first 12 months as president, with many challenging issues at the fore. We've managed to slightly grow our membership, strengthen our financial position and continue to provide a great source of entertainment and interest at all the shows we've attended. I think this is a great opportunity to strengthen our relationship with Caterpillar and the dealers, and showcase the rich history that we all know exists to anyone that will listen. 9	Membership reportG.Slocombe gave account of membership status, reminding those present that the definition of Chapter 19 member is someone that is a financial member of ACMOC and has confirmed they wish to be associated with, and receive correspondence from Chapter 19. ACMOC financial members can be members of more than one Chapter.The Chapter 19 currently has 146 members that were financial with ACMOC (up from 144 same time last year), of which the breakdown is as follows.• Vic = 92 (+3) • NSW = 20 (+1) • SA = 20 • Tas = 9 (-2) • ACT = 1 • WA = 0 • QLD = 3 • UK = 1There were 7 Chapter memberships that expired this financial year that have not been renewed. This is down from 11 last year.		

9 cont.	There are 265 (up 10 from prior year) financial ACMOC members in Australia distributed as follows. ACT = 1 (-1) NSW = 59 (+6) NT = 2 (+1) QLD = 48 (0) SA = 34 (+1) TAS = 10 (-1) Vic = 92 (+3) WA = 19 (+1) Pleasingly we have retained 100% of the Victorian financial ACMOC members as being associated with Chapter 19, which is a fantastic result. Glen thanked Phil Hughes for his assistance in ringing members that were overdue. As members may be aware the Club prefers renewals to now be processed directly online with credit card. This removes administrative burden for the Club and Chapter and with annual automatic renewal will also assist retention rates going forward.

Current catalogue and price list is available online. Stock levels have therefore increased this year and closed at \$6,583.23

Daryl advised additional gaskets were now available and other products like glass fuel bowls and rain traps were underway. We have reached an agreement with TOMM magazine to have a recurring ad in the classifieds for replica parts.

## Treasurer's report

2022/23 was the first full year post Covid with our attendance for the first time at the Geelong Rally and the May Lake Goldsmith rally going ahead. The Chapter also supported Chapter 29 to attend the NHMA National Rally and ran a successful merchandise store. Unfortunately, the November LGSPA rally was cancelled due to floods. Revenue of \$40,758.87 was up \$13,777.37 (51%) from last year, predominantly due to increased merchandise sales, and reflecting donations to go towards 2025 projects.

With changes to the Club's operations many attempts were made to secure remaining merchandise before the store was closed with some success resulting in new items being made available, as well as purchasing discounted and new model stock from Custom Originals. This investment resulted in a significant increase of merchandise sales of \$10,747.87 up \$6,170.87 (135%). Clearly new stock and attending new locations continues to result in impulse purchases from the public and members alike. With no investment in such merchandise from the Club, the Chapter has taken the lead with new items such as the Block C t-shirts and polo tops.

Replica parts revenue declined due to no grader tyre sales which are high value item but were otherwise consistent.

The increased revenue allowed the Chapter to make significant investments in purchasing a new branded 6m x 3m marquee for use at rallies at a cost of \$2,996.00 and purchase additional merchandise stock. This year saw the Chapter enter into a contract with Vitamin Media to prepare a business case to secure external funding to produce what is currently titled the 'Building Australia' documentary to support Caterpillar and its dealers to recognise the role Caterpillar has in Australia as part of 2025 Caterpillar centenary celebrations. This investment was made up of a philanthropic donation from a Chapter member, \$5000 donation from William Adams and \$7000 donation from Caterpillar of Australia and is aligned with the Clubs mission statement.

Given the investments made, the Chapter made an overall small loss for the year of \$258.47.

When considering revenue activities of the Chapter, merchandise sales generated \$610.16 @ 6% gross profit, which will need to be an area of focus, with increased purchase and shipping costs requiring necessary price increases. Conversely, replica parts were a much better result generating \$1,945.00 @ 28% gross profit excluding the impact of merchant fees (Square Credit Card and PayPal). You will note that payments for replica parts exceeded revenue this year in the cash flow report, that is due to consignment sales from the prior 2021/22 year (accrued liability) being remitted in the current 2022/23 year along with current consignment sales. Going forward rather than accrue these as a liability I will ensure they are reconciled in the same year.

Trading expenses were well managed, and we fully recovered direct costs associated with managing membership payments of behalf of the Club (despite declining AU\$ to U\$\$) and outbound postage recovery.

This year we collected NHMA insurance dues from 39 ACMOC members that will be paid on their behalf to NHMA in the 2023/24 financial year. This is done on a cost recovery basis and no profit is realised on providing this service to members.

As at June 30, 2023 we had unrestricted cash funds of \$15,653.18 available, as well as a surplus of \$874.09 in our PAYPAL account which continues to hold the Chapter in a healthy financial state.

Thank you to William Adams accountants for their assistance in preparation and review of the Chapters accounts this year.
